



Return as planned for garden waste

Garden waste collections will restart on the usual collection day in the fortnight that begins Monday 13 September.

From 13 September, you can also order garden sack collections and buy garden waste subscriptions via My Waste Services at somersetwaste.gov.uk. Eight weeks have been added to all subscriptions. Check pick-ups via My Collection Day at somersetwaste.gov.uk (tip: postcode gap AB1 2CD).

Subscribers must not overfill garden waste bins or leave lids open as this could damage the truck hoist and potentially put passers-by at risk. If the crew judges it too heavy, the bin weight must be reduced to 40kgs or less.

Question? Check all the information at somersetwaste.gov.uk/gardenwaste-suspension and complete the online

form if you still need to make contact. If you cannot use the online form, **DO NOT** contact your district council. Instead, call this dedicated garden waste service number: 01823 589900 (line open 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday, until Friday 17 September).

The six-week suspension allowed the garden waste drivers to support vital recycle and rubbish pick-ups.

Collections getting back on track

After weeks of collections disruption from the LGV driver shortage, SWP and its contractor SUEZ expect to have sufficient staff for all recycle and rubbish rounds every day and to be able to return for any reported missed collection within two working days.

Any missed collections should be reported after 7pm of the day of the miss, ideally online using My Waste Service on the SWP homepage.

The continuing national driver shortage and COVID uncertainties mean the situation remains fragile, but everything possible is being done to maintain a reliable collection service. If you live in the Taunton Deane area, full details of the new Recycle More kerbside collections will land on your door mat very soon. Much more recycling will be taken every week, and emptier rubbish bins taken every three
